

Travelling to SERIAC 2017

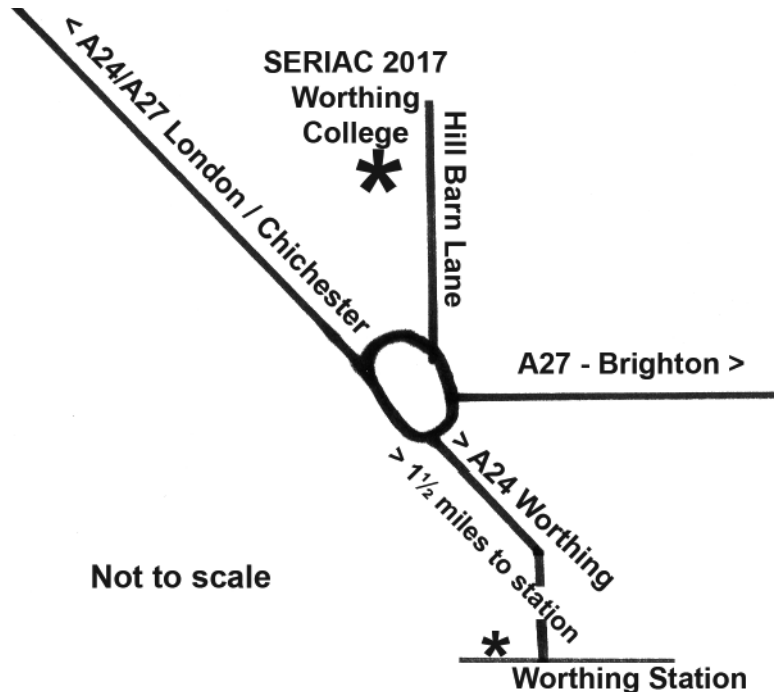
Train: Worthing has direct trains from London Victoria, Brighton, Portsmouth and Southampton. The station is approx. 1½ miles from the College.

Courtesy Coach : A free coach has been arranged to make 2 trips between the railway station and the college. This will leave the station approx. 5 minutes after the arrival of the London services and to allow users of other rail services to join. *It is important to indicate when booking* if you wish to use this free facility. At the formal end of the conference there will be 2 trips to return delegates to the station.

Bus: There are limited services, that do require some walking at either or both ends.

Car: The college is located by the large roundabout on the A27, where the A24 diverges towards Worthing (the college is visible to the north from the roundabout). Take the Hill Barn Lane turning. There is adequate parking on site - reserved disabled parking is near the entrance.

On Site: There are stairs and a lift to the first floor for the conference.



SERIAC Bursaries

SERIAC provides a small number of bursaries up to £500 to support IA in the SERIAC region. The nature of that support is flexible e.g. fieldwork, publication, enhancing the public understanding of IA, etc. Applicants do not have to live in the SERIAC area but the work proposed must centre on the region.
