A ROYAL DELIVERY FROM PARKGATE HOUSE

Parkgate's Prep 4 pupils had the unique experience of working with On Cookery Club to make a showpiece of the Queen's Coronation Crown using macarons as a tribute to the Queen's important and valuable work.

Part of Parkgate's ethos is to support the local community and local charities through community projects, so the opportunity to work with On Cookery Club was not one we could miss! On Cookery Club is a social enterprise designed to teach food lovers different styles of baking in their school. Goods made during the classes are donated to local charities such as Battersea Arts Centre and Comic Relief. The cookery school teaches patisserie making such as macarons, éclairs, croquembouche and chiffon cake. The aim of the school is to one day have an apprentice programme available for young adults.

Our Prep 4 pupils gathered at the On Cookery Club kitchen in Clapham on Thursday 27th June where they were coached by trained chefs as to how to decorate the macarons in the shape of the Coronation Crown. The workshop gave the children the opportunity to express their creativity with a medium

that is not usually used in the classroom: a macaron! Working with chocolate, they replicated the precious stones on the Jubilee Crown. The pupils thoroughly enjoyed themselves and were encouraged to use their own imagination and creativity. The crown was then delivered to Her Majesty, the Queen, by Deputy Headteacher Miss Treherne and three Parkgate pupils; Sadie Soverall, Charlie Humphreys and John Hoh.

Described as amazing, delicious and exciting, it was a truly extraordinary experience that the children were thrilled to have been a part of and will long be remembered!

focus for the year; 'The Continent of North America'.



SWIMMING - PERSONAL SURVIVAL LEVEL 1 & 2

Each summer, our Prep 5 and Prep 6 pupils take part in their Personal Survival Badges where they're tested on a range of challenges whilst fully clothed. The premise is extremely exciting and at first a bit silly, being fully clothed in a swimming pool is a bit of a strange experience.

However, this is an extremely important life skill and it is seen by us as the final piece of the jigsaw in terms of the children's swimming education. Below

is the list of the different challenges that the children will be tested on to earn their Level 1 or Level 2 badges. Everyday clothes must be worn as this test replicates what may happen when you fall into water fully clothed.

To make it even more challenging these sequences are completed continuously and at the end of both tests the children are asked a series of questions on survival in the water. I am delighted to report that all children passed this year and it was great to witness how hard the children worked for these awards.

This was no easy feat considering the examiner was none other than Sensei Rami who is the President of the Fudokan Karate Association

Sensei Rami was also kind enough to put on some demonstrations for us and he even bought out the iconic wooden boards for the children to punch



through. Most managed it, I won't name names but not everyone managed to break the boards (...Mr Meli) but all really enjoyed the experience. It's hard to pick out any individual, but Max Cain fulfilled not only his ambition but his long known talent after being
