OTHER GARDENS OF INTEREST IN THAMES AND CHILTERNS South Oxfordshire

Prosperous, historic market towns of Henley-on-Thames, Wallingford and Thame provide an alluring introduction to South Oxfordshire's roll-call of fascinating houses and gardens. Close to Henley is a rich variety of historic houses that includes picturesque Greys Court, Stonor, home of Lord and Lady Camoys and the Stonor family for over 800 years and Mapledurham, the Elizabethan manor on the Thames which inspired E. M. Shepherd's illustrations of Toad Hall - now with the only working water mill on the river. Other places of note are Nuffield Place, the 1930s-style home of Lord Nuffield (William Morris of Morris Motors) whose 4 acres gardens were developed during and after World War One and Waterperry Gardens near Wheatley, formerly an agricultural college. Waterperry boasts superb herbaceous borders and a shop selling home produced fruits and flowers it is also home to the large annual event 'Art in Action'. Specialist centres include the delightful Herb Farm at Sonning Common with its Saxon Maze and Mattocks Roses found at Notcutts Garden at Nuneham Courtney.
