


ANNUAL REVIEW 2016

Another busy and exciting year is under our belt and we are delighted to report that our caravan has proved a huge success with 80% occupancy over its first fifteen months of operation and bookings throughout the whole of the year ahead. But this is only one aspect of *Miracles*' wide reaching charity work and it is often difficult to encapsulate the wide variety of needs we embrace. From our free prosthesis treatment in Bosnia to Rapid Response Casework here at home; from offering Respite Breaks to paying off a telephone bill for a mother submerged in debt; from refurbishing wheelchairs to helping with hospital transport and special medical equipment - and so much more. And now our prison work is developing, offering music therapy as part of drug rehabilitation and welfare work with prisoners' families.

A Great British Experience

At the Eaton Square School fundraiser for *Miracles* in March the "Guards Experience" was an auction prize for which the winning bid of £1,500 was won by *Miracles*' CEO, Robert Linley-Munro to be given to a group of *Miracles*' children.

The prize, arranged by Tommy McDonald-Milner in conjunction with Colonel Tom Bonas of The Welsh Guards, was in two parts. The first was to be present at the rehearsal of the Trooping of the Colour, and was taken by our marathon runner Louis Williams' family.





The second was a visit to Wellington Barracks to witness the behind the scenes activities prior to the Changing of The Guard at Buckingham Palace.

This was given to a group of children from The Tommy Flowers School in Tower Hamlets who were accompanied by Project Director James Burton.

James writes: It was a privilege to accompany The Tommy Flowers students on this memorable experience which started with a tour of the barracks, stables meeting the horses and the dedicated men and women who keep them in their prime. We saw and touched the famous gun carriages and the guns which were used at The Battle of The Somme in 1916. Also we watched, at close quarters, the Troop inspections and the ceremony of handing over The Queen's Colours on the parade ground, the spectacles which attract thousands of visitors every day. The Band of The Coldstream Guards then serenaded the students with a couple of uplifting tunes, marching off to Buckingham Palace for the daily Changing of The Guard to take place.







The visit was topped off with a look at some of the uniforms and even trying on some of the iconic bearskins, handling the swords and inspecting the boots with their soles containing twelve iron studs, each one representing a guardsman who won The Victoria Cross during The Crimean War.

On departure every student was presented with a hard back book describing the history of the Guards.

What a Great British keepsake to remind them of a most memorable visit!

Together with the massive tombola and the huge generosity of guests, the evening raised the grand sum of one hundred thousand Swiss Francs. The night belonged to Amina but the Guest of Honour stole the show! He was the famous Swiss author, Joel Dicker, whose novel 'The Truth About The Harry Quebert Affair' was one of the world's best sellers with his third book likely to follow suit. Such a really lovely man, too, and one of the original supporters of La Fondation *Miracles* Suisse.

MIRACLES MISSION IN BOSNIA-HERZEGOVINA

The *Miracles* 'Prosthetics Team's excellent work in Mostar goes from strength to strength and we are all deeply grateful to the Children of The World Charity for its pledge of \$30,000 pa over the next three years towards the general running of the *Miracles* Centre. This past year, with funding from La Fondation *Miracles* Suisse, The International Trust Fund and St. Joseph and the Helpers Charity we have been able to provide a total of 43 new limbs over the year along with 57 corrections; 3 foot replacements; 27 insoles; 5 orthotic devices and 12 silicon gels.

We are delighted to have welcomed Sophie Fauchier twice this year along with several representatives from La Fondation, the ITF and German Embassy, St. Joseph's and The Helpers Charity and the Jericho Foundation as well as Pierre Kern and Tony Giglio, CPOs from Switzerland (*right*) whose help, professional input and ongoing commitment to our work is most welcome.



Visits from local schools and student seminars have taken place at the Centre plus sessions with physiotherapy students and those from the Faculty of Mechanical Engineering at Mostar University.









The Jericho Foundation has also generously donated to our work with Roma families in Zenica of which there are now 6 adults and 24 children: 16 being of school age and one who is now studying at university.

Project Green Shoots continues to be fruitful, providing vegetables almost all year round.

Growing their own crops and raising their chickens and animals is both rewarding and enjoyable.





Their gardens, greenhouses and orchards form a particularly valuable legacy when *Miracles*' ten-year commitment comes to an end with the houses being gifted to the families and the Project to the Municipality of Zenica. *Miracles* will, of course, be always there for them.









Miracles Music in Prisons Project

Following the success of last year's Music Workshop held in Brixton Prison Drug Rehabilitation Wing, Miracles' Project Director, James Burton, along with a fellow musician, Andrew Harwood, has developed the project further, running another four month course in the women's prison, HMP Downview.

Launched on 4th November 2016, the sessions took place each Friday afternoon and included vocal and physical warm up; a group song 'Lean on Me' by Bill Withers, beginners guitar and song writing activities.

Ten prisoners attended the course. The background and age of each being very varied with most having drug related convictions ranging from months to 7 years. The feedback from the course was excellent, all participants benefitting enormously from being able to develop their individual musical talents and shared ideas, creating feelings of achievement to counter their complex emotions.

With full backing from the Miracles Board of Trustees and a grant from the Big Lottery, James and Andrew (Pictured left) are now working to develop the project further in other London Prisons.

As one of our Trustees commented: 'This project is a truly excellent way of making miracles happen in some very tragic lives.

Miracles 'Project Respite



The first *Miracles*' Caravan in the Bunn Leisure Holiday Park in Selsey, West Sussex, has now been in operation for fifteen months in which time it has catered for some forty families with 80% occupancy. It is almost fully booked through the coming year and this not only highlights its success but also the need to offer more of these badly needed breaks.

Through the past year we have welcomed a number of severely disabled children like Harmonie, a three-year-old who has lost all her lower limbs as a result of Meningitis.

Her family managed to cope in our existing caravan but as with other families like this they really need wheelchair access and special adaptations such as lower work surfaces, hoists and a purpose-built wet room.

Miracles is now determined to acquire a unit such as this, the cost of which—complete with all its essential 'extras' and running costs for the year ahead comes to a total of £60,000. An appeal has now been launched for our supporters to contribute to this very necessary cause.


Miracles' Challenge Champions Raising funds for Caravan Number Two
