FROM THE PEN OF MADAME CHAIR

Dear Friends,

As will be seen from the audited accounts for the past year, we have now capitalized our programme related assets in regard to our Bosnian projects, both of which are fully operational and proving invaluable.

Since the opening of The *Miracles* Centre in Mostar, almost one hundred limbs have been provided, together with the care associated with the treatment and follow-up treatment sessions. This has been funded in partnership with the International Trust Fund and La Fondation *Miracles* Suisse who are also funding advanced training for our Certified Prosthetics and Orthotics Technician (CPO), Nihad Subasic, and the recruitment and training of a second CPO to enable more patients to be treated. I was delighted to be able to watch Nihad at work when I visited the Centre in October with Ingrid Tissot who runs the Swiss Foundation and works so hard on behalf of the Centre.

Guests of *Miracles* Bosnian Mission this year have included our Treasurer, Robert Bean with his Trustee wife Anna and their son Max as well as our Founder, Theo Ellert and her husband Robert Linley-Munro, the highlight of whose trip was their visit to the Roma Community in Zenica which Theo describes later in this Review. The Roma Project is, indeed, a major triumph for *Miracles* with one hundred percent school attendance and all children reaching their relevant grades – thanks to the help of Aida Saric, our Project Supervisor, who coaches them in the Community Centre after school. The families are all integrating well into the surrounding community and working hard on their allotments, with their animals and keeping their homes spotless.

Another of their visitors this year was Joseph Caruso, International Ambassador for the UN Association of Western Australia, with his wife, Carolyn. Joseph has been extremely generous in his support for the Roma Project including the delivery of a huge Container of clothes and other essentials. I am delighted to report that he has now accepted an invitation to join the *Miracles* Board of Trustees and we look forward to welcoming him and to the benefits which he will bring to our charity.

Whilst so much is happening within *Miracles* Bosnia, I am happy to say that *Miracles* UK is still maintaining its service here at home for those in Supreme Need. This service is all the more important in the light of the alarming statistic which has recently come to our notice that the child poverty rate in this country is one in three which explains the number of requests for help we receive from breadline poverty families who have insufficient food and no money for school uniforms, trips or transport. An increased effort is being made to find additional funding for this vital work and your continued support for it will be deeply appreciated.

Finally I would like to pay tribute to Amada and Robert Maxwell who have reluctantly resigned from our Board of Trustees – but will always remain as friends. Amada's enthusiasm and drive over the years has been a great blessing for *Miracles* and Robert's business acumen was of huge benefit to our Bosnian operation. Thank you both from us all – and we hope to see you amongst us again in the not too distant future.

With my warmest regards to all who read this Review. I hope you enjoy it and that you will continue to support *Miracles* again through another busy year ahead.

With major funding from The International Trust Fund and La Fondation *Miracles* Suisse, 87 limbs have now been made and fitted at The *Miracles* Centre in Mostar by our Certified Prosthetics and Orthotics Technician, Nihad Subasic, who is now assisted by Admir Zekic, our new CPO, and Laboratory Assistant, Amel Mrkonjic, who are also funded by our Swiss Foundation.

In October, on behalf of La Fondation *Miracles* Suisse, Marie-Antoinette Pereire and Ingrid Tissot visited the Centre which is just outside the ancient city of Mostar.

They were accommodated in the well appointed visitors' apartment and spent much time meeting the staff and patients. Among the latter, they were impressed by two smiling young men who had been fitted with new legs and were back for a check up.



They told how the ill fitted prosthetic legs they had been using before had been very restrictive but now, with the limbs provided by *Miracles*, they could walk, run, cycle, play football and look forward to a normal and fulfilling life.

Ingrid is now back in Geneva and fired with enthusiasm for the work of the *Miracles* Centre which is, of course, the *raison d'être* of the Swiss Foundation.

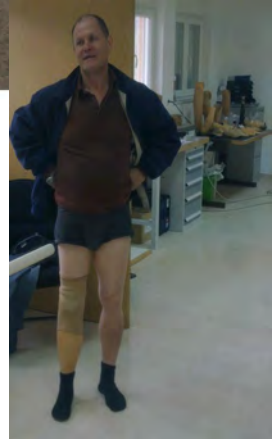


... For Prosthesis and Care

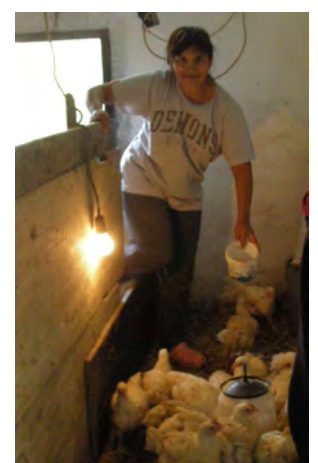


Out of the eighteen children old enough to go to school, all of them reached their grades to the delight of Aida Saric, the Supervisor, who coaches them in the Community Centre after school; three are now going on to High School, two of the older ones have found themselves jobs, and one is waiting for a Course in Mechanics.

Their houses and gardens are immaculate; their chicken production project is booming and they now have turkeys, sheep and goats to keep them busy as well as their allotments and fruit trees.

In their spare time the children play football and basketball with our translator and security officer, Andrej Plavsic, who also encourages them to speak a little English.

Just one year on and the *Miracles* Housing and Education project has proved itself a success from every aspect. It is truly a tremendous achievement which deserves the highest praise and support.



Miracles at Home



With years of painful treatment and physiotherapy behind her, Nikki Malins has finally taken her first step on her prosthetic leg.

She is now hoping against hope that somehow the other leg can be saved.



As a reward for Nikki and a little bonus for her carer-daughter, Lauren, *Miracles* recently arranged for them to have a break in the sun at a special hotel for the disabled in Tenerife which was not only a treat but a benefit, too, and one they both thoroughly deserved.

Amongst this year's cases referred from Great Ormond Street Children's Hospital for *Miracles'* help is beautiful Jessica Cannons. A very sick 14-year-old from Worthing, Jessica has spent years in and out of hospital and finally had a life-saving heart transplant in June.

Miracles help was requested for the many hospital trips needed to be made and to enable her Mum to be with her during the crucial hours.

Sadly the house was sold in 2007 to fund vital research and our respite breaks became few and far between.



Last year another miracle came about in the form of Canute Cottages - a delightful (specially adapted) holiday complex on the beautiful Chichester Harbour whose generous owner, Diana Beale, now welcomes our families whenever she has a vacancy.

It has recently come to the attention of *Miracles*' Board of Trustees that Britain has a child poverty rate of one in three—the highest of any other country in the developed world. Cases of such poverty are constantly being referred to *Miracles* by CABs, Social Workers and Hospitals throughout the country and increased funding for our UK Crisis work is urgently sought to provide the help they so desperately need.

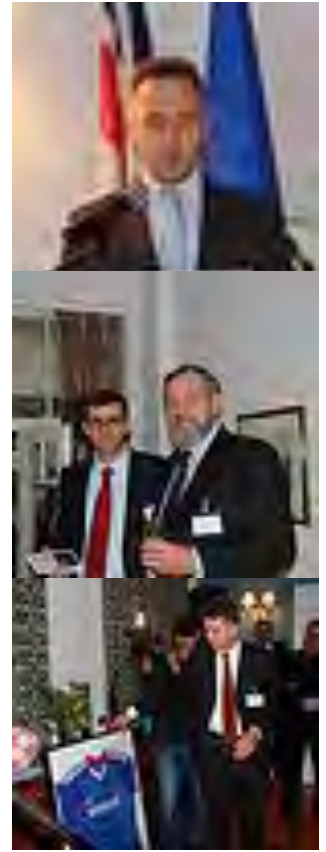
Who's Doing What ...

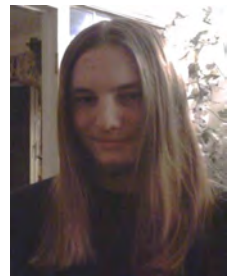
... for *Miracles*

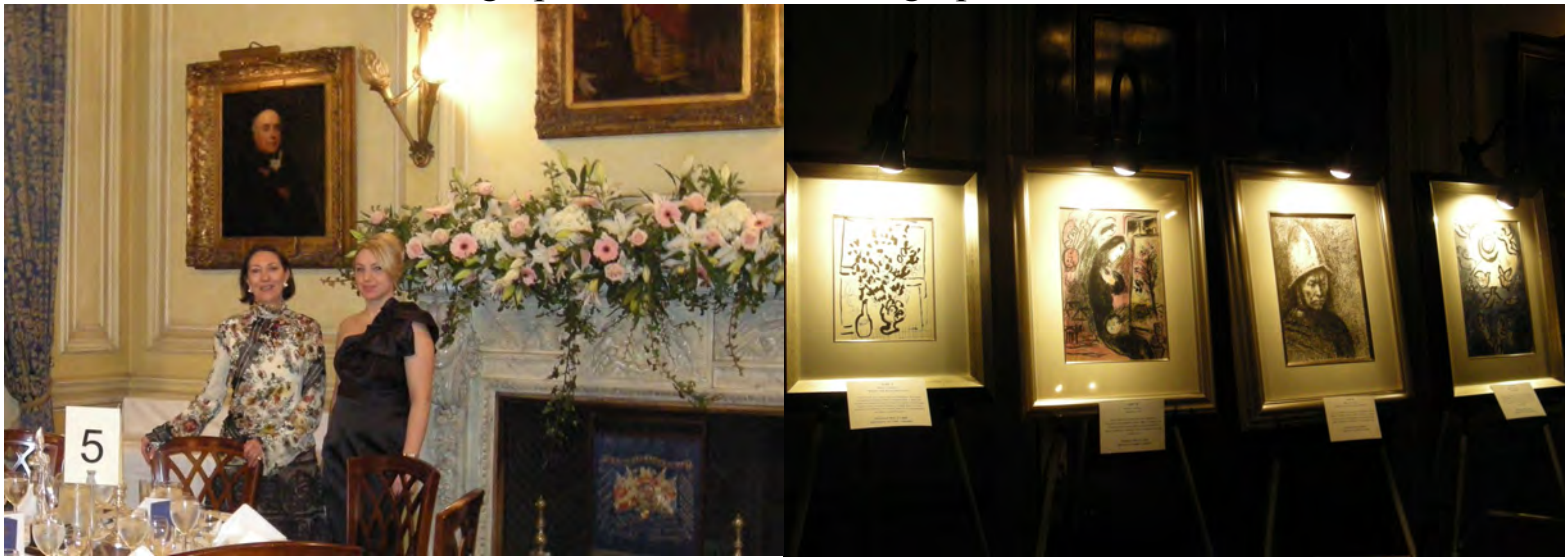
